NEBRASKA LAW GOVERNING RELEASE OF FINANCING STATEMENTS

1-FL-Nebr. Form 4
(Rev. 7-2-76)

SECTION 9-406 OF THE NEBRASKA UCC PROVIDES A RELEASE FEE OF FIFTY CENTS FOR EACH RELEASE. IT ALSO PROVIDES THAT FAILURE TO FURNISH A TERMINATION STATEMENT TO THE DEBTOR, WITHIN TEN DAYS OF WRITTEN DEMAND BY HIM, SUBJECTS THE SECURED PARTY TO PAYMENT TO THE DEBTOR OF \$100.00 AND ANY ACTUAL LOSS SUFFERED BY THE DEBTOR. THE BORROWER MUST PAY ANY EXPENSE CONNECTED WITH RELEASING SECURITY INSTRUMENTS.

AMENDMENT BY ACT THAT BECAME OPERATIVE JULY 1, 1970.

SECTION 1. THE FEES SET FORTH IN THE UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE, ARTICLE 9, PART 9-406, SHALL APPLY TO FILING OF ALL INSTRUMENTS ON PAPER EIGHT BY FIVE INCHES IN SIZE. FOR INSTRUMENTS FILED ON PAPER OF ANY OTHER SIZE THERE SHALL BE ADDED TO THE UNIFORM FEE FOR FILING THE SUM OF ONE DOLLAR AND FIFTY CENTS.
