

the Northwest Quarter (NW 1/4) of Section Twenty Seven (27), Township Eleven (11) North, Range Nine (9) West of the 6th P.M. Hall County, Nebraska and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the southwest corner of said Lot 24; thence running northerly along the west line of Lots 24,23 and 22 a distance of Three Hundred Ninety Three (393.0) feet to the northwest corner of Lot 22; thence running easterly a distance of Eight Hundred Sixty Seven (867.0) feet to the northeast corner of Lot 22; thence running southerly along the east line of Lots 22,23 and 24 a distance of Three Hundred Eighty Seven and Fourty Six Hundredths (387.46) feet to the southeast corner of Lot 24, thence running southwesterly along the southeasterly line of Lot 24 (also being the boundary line of Thavenet Ice Pond Tract) a distance of Fifty Two and Seven Tenths (52.7) feet to a point on the east line of Lot 25 also being a corner of the Thavenet Ice Pond Tract; thence running northerly along the east line of Lot 25 a distance of Twenty Two (22.0) feet; thence running westerly along the south line of Lot 24 a distance of Eight Hundred Twenty Two (822.0) feet to the point of beginning and containing 7.81 acres more or less.

NOTE: The relationship of Thavenet Ice Pond Tract to Matthew's Subdivision is shown incorrectly on the plat of Matthew's Subdivision. Field survey shows the location of the property lines of the Southeast corner of Lot Twenty Four (24) to be as shown on this plat. These property lines are as shown on the plat of Thavenet Ice Pond Tract recorded in Book 46 at Page 204 in the office of Register of Deeds Office, Hall County, Nebraska; filed July 15,1911; and are the actual boundary lines located at the Southeast corner of said Lot. Twenty Four (24) and the adjoining part of Thavenet Ice Pond Tract.
