All of the rest, residue and remainder of my possessions, real,
personal and otherwise, I bequeath, give, devise and make
to my son-in-law; George Johnson, John, James,
and William, William from Stapkey, and to my niece, Anna, if she
and she alive. If any of the aforesaid aforesaid die before me,
I bequeath to them the wife or children of such deceased, all their
possessions.
