FIRAL DECREE

THE IT REMEMBERED that on this 19th day of Movember, 1952, it being the day fixed for approving the final account of the administratrix and hearing on her petition for final settlement and determination of heirship, and it appearing from proof on file that due notice was given by publication of the time heretofore fixed for said hearing, and there being no objections on file and the Court being fully advised in the premises finds:

- 1. That Emmett Q. Bloyd, also known as Emmett Bloyd, died on April 27, 1952, a resident of Hall County, Hebracka; that he left surviving him as his next of kin and heirs-at-law, Lila Bloyd, his widow; a daughter, Beverly J. Bloyd, born Hovember 8, 1936, and a daughter, Lucille Blisabeth Bloyd, born March 28, 1946; that he left no other living children, nor the living issue of any deceased children, and that the above-mamed persons are his sole and only heirs-at-law; that the widow, Lila Bloyd, is not the mother of Beverly J. Bloyd, but is the mother of Lucille Blisabeth Bloyd.
- 2. That on June 18, 1952, Lila Bloyd was appointed administratrix of his estate, qualified as such and has been acting in said capacity ever since.
- 3. That due notice was given to creditors of the time limit/in which to file claims against said estate, and that such time/as duly expired; that no claims were filed in said estate and that the further presentation of claims against said estate has been barred by the former order of this Court; that there is no inheritance tax due the State of Mebraska and no federal estate tax due the United States of America.
- 4. The first and final report of the administratrix, filed herein, is in all things true, correct and complete, and should be approved and allowed as her final report; that there remains in her hands, the sum of \$203.50; that the court costs herein are \$47.65, and the fee for the attorney, Donald H. Veaver, for his services in this Court, are \$185.00, leaving a net deficiency, which the widew, Lila-Bloyd, has agreed to pay, together with the funeral bill in the amount of \$554.00.
