5. That the said Emmett 0. Bloyd died seized and personned of Lot Two (2) Block Eleven (11), Bonnie Bras Addition to the City of Grand Island, Nebracks, which premises were held in the same of Remott Bloyd, and which according to law descends one-fourth to the videw, Lila Blord, three-eighths to Beverly J. Bloyd and three-eighths to Lumille Blisabeth Bloyd, subject, hovever, to the right of homestend of the vidov, Lila Bloyd.

IT IS, THUREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDINARD, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT:

That the report of Lila Bloyd, administratrix, filed herein, be and the sample hereby in all things approved and allowed as and for her final account and in full settlement of her trust; that the balance of \$203.50, in her hands, shall be applied to the payment of court costs and costs of administration; that upon filing receipts for the same, the administratrix be discharged, and she and her surety released from all further liability on their official bond.

That Remetted. Bloyd died intestate, on April 27, 1952, a resident of Hall County, Mebraska; that he left surviving him Lila Bloyd, his vidow, and a daughter, Beverly J. Bloyd died seized and possessed of Lot Two (2), Block Eleven (11), Bonnde Bree Addition to the City of Grand Island, Hebrasks, which premises are held in the name of Rumett Bloyd, and which descends to and hereby is assigned as follows: one-fourth to the widow, Lila Bloyd, three-eighths to Reverly J. Bloyd and three-eighths to Lucille Elizabeth Bloyd, subject, however, to the right of hemostead of the vidow, Lila Bloyd.
