

(b) That the said deceased conveyed to her son, Harold A. Bainforth property owned by her and described as follows, on the date aforesaid: The West Half of the Southeast Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4} \text{ SE}_4$ ) of Section Thirty (30), Township Nine (9), North, Range ten (10), West of the P.M., Hall County, Nebraska, which on the date of conveyance was valued and appraised at \$9,000.00.

(c) That the said deceased conveyed to her son, Mr. John W. Bainforth property located in and described as follows, on the last lines of the first page of the Northwest quarter of Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Nine (9), Range One (1), west of the Meridian, Mill County, Oregon, which was part of the property described in the above instrument.

(2) That the said proposal conveyed by the author, mentioned in the preceding paragraph, is based on a misconception. First, it follows, on the one hand, from point (1), that the (2), mentioned in the title of the present article, is not the proposal, but on the other, of the original and general interpretation.
