County Court Boom in said County as the time and place for hearing said Petition, proving said Will and admitting the same to probate and ordering that
notice of the pendancy of said petition and hearing thereon he given to all
persons interested in said matter by publishing said notice in the Grand Island
Independent, a legal newspaper printed in said County, for three successive
weeks prior to said day of hearing, and it appears by proof on file that notice
of said order was so given.

THIRD

The Court further finds that on the 21st day of August, 1952, said instrument was proven, allowed and admitted to probate as the Last Will and Testament of said John Wohm, deceased, which last Will and Testament is in words as follows:

" LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

I, John Kehm, of Grand Island, Nebraska, being of sound mind and disposing emory, do hereby make, publish and declare this my Last Will and Testament, in words as follows:

I hereby device and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my outste of every nature whatsoever, wheresoever situate, unto my dear wife, Elizabeth Kehm, should she survive may in the event that she precede me in death, then I hereby device and bequeath all of said rest, residue and remainder of my setate, share and share alike, unto our six children, namely: Valter Kehm, Lee Kehm, Harold Kehm, Sum Kehm, Lyria Speak and Florine Cook, to them and to their respective heirs forever.
