Now on this 6th day of March, 1953, at 10:00 A. M., this cause came on regularly to be heard upon the Petition for Settlement of Final Account and Distribution of Leo G. Rice, Administratrix of the estate of Henry Ralph Rice, deceased, praying for a final settlement and allowance of her accounts, a decree of heirship, and decree assigning and distributing the residue of said estate and a discharge from her trust as such Administratrix, and further for a determination of state inheritance tax and any state or federal estate tax, for a determination of fees and commissions due said Administratrix and the attorneys employed by her, and for such other and further orders or proceedings as might be required by the statutes; said Administratrix appeared in person with one of her attorneys, Kenneth H. Olson, of the firm of Knob & Olson; and it appearing to the Court that due and sufficient notice was given to Donald H. Weaver, County Attorney of Hall County, Nebraska, of the time and place of hearing for the determination of the state inheritance tax due, if any; and it appearing to the Court after carefully examining the records and files in this proceeding and being fully advised in the premises, that due and sufficient notice of this hearing has been given as provided by law and the order of this Court and from the evidence and testimony introduced at this hearing, the Court finds as follows:

1. That the Final Report and Accounting of said Administratrix, as filed herein, is true and correct in all respects and should be settled, allowed and approved.
2. That the statements and allegations in said Petition for Settlement of Final Account and Distribution of the Administratrix are true and correct.
