NOW on this lith day of March, 1953, this cause came on for hearing upon the final report filed herein by Judson C. Shields, administrator of said estate, and upon the approval and allowance of said report, settlement of said estate and his discharge, and the Court being Jully advised in the premises finds as follows:

That C. R. Shields, also known as Clayborn R. Shields, departed this life on the 20th day of January, 1952 a resident and inhabitant of Hall County, Hebraska and was the owner of an estate to be administered in said County; that said Judson C. Shields filed his petition in this Court on the 16 day of February, 1952 praying for administration of said estate, and upon reading and filing said petition an order was entered fixing the time and place for hearing the evidence in support of said petition, giving notice the eof to all interested parties by publication of said notice for three successive weeks in the Grand Island Daily Independent, a legal newspaper published and circulated in said County, as by law required, and letters of administration were granted to said Judson C. Shields upon the filing of his bond in this Court and the same being approved, as, by law required.

That due and legal notice has been given to all persons of the time and place fixed by the Court for filing claims against said estate by publishing the same for three successive weeks in the Grand'Island Daily Independent, a legal newspaper, as by law required, and that all persons having claims against said estate, not filed within the time fixed by the Court, if any such there be, are forever barred, excluded and enjoined from setting up or asserting any such claims against said estate.

That said deceased departed this life leaving surviving him as his heirs at law and only heirs at law, legatees, devisees, and persons entitled to share in his estate the following: Olga E. Shields, widow, Doniphan, Nebraska; Floyd W. Shields, son, Omaha, Nebraska; Medrick D. Shields, son, Norwalk, California; Marjorie A. Thomas, daughter, Eggertswille, New York; Elaine D. Daniels, daughter, McCook, Nebraska; Berdetta K. Frieke, also known as Berdetta A. Friecke, daughter, Hastings, Nebraska; Anita C. Bunde, daughter, Hastings, Nebraska; Dolores I. Breitenfeldt, also known as Deloris I. Breitenfeldt, daughter, Doniphan, Nebraska; and Judson C. Shields, son, Doniphan, Nebraska, all over the age of twenty-one years.

The Court further finds that said deceased died the joint owner, with right of survivorship in the widow, Olga E. Shields, of the following described real estate, to-wh:

The East Forty-six Feet (E46') of the West Seventy-one Feet (W71') of Lot Four (4) in Block One (1), Original Town of Doniphan, Hall County, Hebraska

and personal property as set out in the inventory filed herein, which said personal property consisted of furniture and fixtures of a certain pool hall located in Donipham, Hall County, Nebraska, in the premises above described and that said building and business have been sold as a going business and proper distribution has been made to the persons and heirs entitled thereto, receipts for which shall be filed by the administrator herein.

That said above described real estate did pass and descend unto Olga E. Shields, widow of said deceased, in fee simple title by right of survivorship and that the value of said real estate was less than the statutory exemptions allowed her under any inheritance or gift tax of the State of Mebraska or the United States of America.
