in said cause by publishing said notice in the Grand Island Independent, a legal newspaper printed in said County, for three successive weeks prior to said day of hearing, and it appears by proof on file that notice of said order was given as ordered by this Court.

## THIRD

The Court further finds that said Edgar Van Buskirk named in said petition was, upon his giving bond in the sum of \$1,000.00, as ordered by this Gurt, appointed Administrator as prayed; the Court further finds that the deceased at the time of his death was a widower, that his wife preceded him in death and that he left the following heirs—at-law:

Pearl Van Buskirk and Hasel M. Kingston,

both over the age of twenty-one, they being all of the children of said decedent; that said decedent left him surviving no other lineal descendants whomsever.

## POURTH

That on the 5th day of November, 1952, an order was made herein allowing oreditors three months from and after the 3rd day of December, 1952, in which to file
their claims against said estate and said Administrator one year in which to settle
said estate, and further ordering that notice to creditors be published in the Orand
Island Independent, a legal newspaper published and circulating in Hall County,
Nebraska for three successive weeks prior to said 3rd day of December 1952, and
that a hearing on claims filed against said estate would be held at the office of
the County Judge of Hall County, Nebraska, on the 5th day of March, 1923, at 9 o'clock
a.t., and it appears by proof on file that notice of said order was published as
ordered by this Court.

## FIFTH

The Court further finds that on the 12th day of November, 1952, said Edgar on Buskirk, as Administrator, filed in Court his inventory with a copy hereof for the County Assessor of Hall County, Nebraska, of the property of said estate, and that according to said inventory, the degeased died seiged and possessed of the following described property, to-writ:

Lote Seven (7) and Eight (8) in Block Eight (8) in the coriginal Town of Domiphan, in Hall County, Nebruska,

Miscellaneous old household furniture;

that said decedent owned no property jointly with others at the time of his death,
