

widow, Martha E. Oldsen Rhoda, formerly Martha E. Oldsen, Anna Detweiler and Alma Seavill, who are the daughters of the said John Dohrn and Mary Dohrn, and are of lawful age, and that there was no child or children of any deceased child or children of the said John Dohrn.

The Court further finds that the said John Dohrn was the owner at the time of his death of the following described real estate, to-wit:

The Southerly 74.8 feet of Lot Ten (10), in Block Sixteen (16), in Russel Wheeler's Addition to the City of Grand Island, Hall County, Nebraska;

which had a fair market value of the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, and which was the home and homestead of the said John Dohrn and wife, Mary Dohrn, and has heretofore been set off unto her as her homestead.

The Court further finds that there was no other property of the said John Dohrn left by him at the time of his death, either real or personal.

The Court further finds that the expenses of the last illness and funeral expenses have been paid in full; that the gross value of the estate of any and all natures whatsoever subject to taxation did not exceed the sum of \$5000.00; that there could not by any possibility be any Federal Estate Tax or State Inheritance Tax.

The Court further finds that there have been no claims filed in this estate; that the time fixed for filing claims has long since elapsed; that notice of the time fixed for filing claims has been given in the manner and form provided by law.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT that all claims not now on file be and the same are hereby forever barred.

The Court further finds that the Executrices have waived any executory fees; that the total court costs is the sum of \$67<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, and that there should be allowed the Executrices as
