On this 29th day of May, 1891, this cause came on for hearing upon the former orders of the Court, the final report of the Administratrix of said Estate, the report of the appraisers of the homestead and the proof of notice given, according to the former order of this Court, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that due Notice had been given to all persons interested in said estate, of the time set for hearing said report and the time set for making final decree, as to the homestead and no person appearing to object to the allowance of said report, and decree as to said homestead, as prayed for, and no cause being shown why the prayer of said petitioner should not be granted, this cause then came on upon the evidence introduced and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, that the facts stated in said report are true and that the same ought to be allowed, as a final report of said Administratrix; and that all the debts of said deceased have been paid and the expenses of the administration of said estate have been fully paid.

It is therefore ordered that the same be and the same is hereby allowed, as the final report of said Administratrix and she is hereby discharged as such Administratrix.

And it is further found that the following named persons are the heirs and only heirs of said Joseph March, dec'd., to-wit:- Elmer F. March, his widow, Charles March, Kate Law, and Anna Collins, his only brother and sisters. And that real estate belonging to said Deceased, passes to them as his heirs and only heirs at law, by operation of law.
