JULIUS C. STRASSER, DECEASED

FINAL DECREE

Now on this 21st day of August, 1953, this cause came on for hearing upon the Final Report of Emma G. Strasser, Executrix of the estate of Julius C. Strasser, deceased, and upon her petition for the allowance and approval of said report, the settlement of said estate and her discharge herein as Executrix, the matter having been continued from January 30, 1953. and the Court being fully advised in the premises and having examined the records and files herein, finds that due and legal notice has been given to all persons of the time and place fixed by the Court for the hearing upon said Final Report and no one appearing to object thereto, and the Court having examined the same, together with the vouchers on file, finds that the report is true and correct in all things and that the same ought to be approved and allowed as and for her Final Report, the estate closed and the Executrix discharged.

The Court finds that the said Julius C. Strasser departed this life June 11, 1952 in Hall County, Nebraska, and that at the time of his death he was a resident and inhabitant of Hall County, Nebraska, and that he left a Last Will and Testament and a Codicil thereto which were, on consideration of the Court, duly proven, allowed, and admitted to probate on July 11, 1952; that in the said Last Will and Testament, the deceased named and appointed his wife, Emma G. Strasser executrix and that letters testamentary were duly issued to her upon qualifying as such.

The Court further finds that due and legal notice has been given to all persons of the time and place fixed by the Court for the filing of claims against the estate of the deceased and that the time so fixed is fully expired and that all persons having claims against the estate and not filed within the time limited, are forever barred and precluded from setting up or asserting such claims. The Court further finds that all funeral expenses have been paid, that all debts against the estate and the cost of these proceedings have been paid, including taxes and widow's allowance and that the Executrix has nothing further by way of personal property in her possession for
