IN THE MATTER OF THE ESTATE

OF

DECREE

FRANK A. FLOOD, DECEASED

Now on this 2nd day of September, 1953 this cause came on for hearing upon the final report filed herein by Bruce H. Flood, the duly appointed, qualified and acting administrator of the estate of Frank A. Flood deceased, and upon the application for approval and allowance of said report, settlement of said estate, determination of the heirs, distribution of funds, and barring claims against said estate and for his discharge herein, and the Court being fully advised in the matter finds as follows:

That Frank A. Flood departed this life on the 6th day of February, 1953 a resident and inhabitant of Hall County, Nebraska and at the time of his death the owner of said real estate and personal property to be administered in said County; that Bruce H. Flood, son of said decedent, filed his petition in this Court on the 11th day of February, 1953 praying for administration of said estate; that upon reading and filing of said petition an order was entered fixing the time and place for hearing the evidence in support of said petition, giving notice thereof to all interested parties by publication of said notice for three successive weeks in the Grand Island Daily Independent, a local newspaper published and circulated in said County, as by law required, and letters of administration were granted to the said Bruce H. Flood upon filing of his bond in this Court and the same being approved, as by law required.

The Court finds that legal and local notice was given to all persons of the time and place fixed by the Court for filing of claims against said estate by publishing the same for three successive weeks in the Grand Island Daily Independent, a local newspaper, as by law required, and that all persons having any claim against said estate, not filed within the time fixed by the Court, if any such there be, should be forever barred, excluded and excluded from setting up or asserting any such claims against said estate; that all claims on file have been with said estate reported in said Court.

The Court further finds that said decedent departed this life a widower, leaving no issue and only heirs at law, as by law provided, or persons entitled to share in his estate the following, to-wit:

all over twenty-one years of age.

The Court further finds that said decedent died the owner of the following described real estate, to-wit:

Lot Three (3) in Block Fourteen (14) in
H. G. Clark's Addition to the City
of Grand Island, Hall County, Nebraska.

together with certain personal property consisting of household goods, government bonds, and cash in the bank, which said personal property has been accounted for in the final report filed herein; that said real estate above described did pass and descend under and by virtue of the statutes of descent to Della June Grabenstein, daughter; Ruth F. Avery, daughter; Nina Marie Vortiska, daughter; Bruce H. Flood, son; E. Dale Flood, son; equally share and share alike, a one-fifth interest therein, in fee simple title.
