

III. The provisions made in this will for my wife Nellie May Watson are in lieu of Dower, widow's rights, and any other interest she might have in my estate if I left no will.

IV. I bequeath the sum of Four Thousand Five Hundred (\$4,500.00) Dollars to my three children, Alice M. Turner, Dale K. Watson, and Verda M. Biche, ----- and to the survivor or survivors of the said three children in equal shares. I direct that this sum shall be a charge solely upon, and payable solely out of, the securities, negotiable instruments, and monies and credits remaining in my estate after payment of all just claims against my said estate, and costs of administration. I further direct that, in the event of a deficiency of assets for the full payment of the pecuniary legacies hereinbefore bequeathed, said legacies shall abate ratably.

V. I appoint my wife, Nellie May Watson, sole executrix of this my last will, and direct that she be exempt from official bond.

VI. I give and bequeath all the rest, residue, and remainder of my property, real, personal, and mixed, of which I may be seized or possessed, or over which I may have testamentary powers, to my wife, Nellie May Watson, her heirs and assigns, forever.
