M. in Hall County, Nebraska, passed under the terms and provisions of the Last Will and Testament of John K. Watson to his sole and surviving children as follows:

1/21st interest therein to Dale E. Watson, also known as Dale Watson, his son;
1/21st interest therein to Alice A. Turner, also known as Alice Turner, his daughter;
1/21st interest therein to Verda M. Riche, also known as Verda Riche, his daughter;

all of whom are of legal age.

THE COURT FURTHER FINDS that the petitioner herein Dale E. Watson, is a son of the decedent, and claims, as a devisee, a 1/21st interest in and to the South Half of the Southeast Quarter (BASE) of Section Twenty-one (21), Township Ten (10) North, Range Twelve (12), East of the 6th P. M. in Hall County, Nebraska, and is therefore the proper person to bring these proceedings.

THE COURT FURTHER FINDS that the costs of these proceedings have been paid and that a decree should be entered declaring the descent of the real estate owned by the decedent at the time of his death in accordance with the terms of his Last Will and Testament.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT that John K. Watson, deceased, departed this life on the 1st day of May, 1948, a resident of Aurora, Buchanan County, Iowa; that more than 2 years have elapsed since the date of his death; that the Last Will and Testament of the deceased
