Final Decree

Now on this 4th day of December, 1953, this matter came on to be heard on the final report and petition for discharge of Otha Oldfather, Administrator of said estate, and the evidence.

And the evidence being submitted to the court and the court being fully informed in the matter finds that said account is in all respects just true and correct; that in addition thereto the administrator has collected \$75.00 rent since the filing of said report making total receipts in said estate the sum of \$4,787.27; that in addition to the expenditures shown in said final report there are the additional expenditures of \$50.30 for Court costs and \$1.80 for deposit box rental at the Bank of Wood River, Nebraska, and \$24.00 to Lynn Runyan, Court Reporter, making total expenditures in said estate the sum of \$2,231.37, leaving a net balance on hand in said estate in the sum of \$2,555.40; and after the payment of inheritance taxes the sum of \$2,117.40; that all items shown paid out are the fair and reasonable amounts for such expenditures and are hereby approved and allowed by the court as just and proper in said estate.

The court further finds that due and legal notice of the time and place of hearing for said final report and petition for final discharge has been given all persons interested in said estate as provided by law; that there are inheritance taxes due or owing on said estate under the Laws of the State of Nebraska in the sum of \$430.00.

The Court further finds that Myrtle S. Jones died at Wood River, in Hall County, Nebraska, on the 2nd day of April, 1953, intestate, and leaving surviving her as her sole heirs at law, her nephew Donald Charles Fairbanks and her niece, Ruth Fairbanks Johnson; that the personal property passes and descends and is assigned equally to the said Donald Charles Fairbanks and Ruth Fairbanks Johnson, share and share alike.
